# Declaring a notified corridor

- NWTD is being assessed in accordance with the *Major Infrastructure Development Approvals Act 1999 (MIDAA)*. A key step in this process requires the declaring a 'notified corridor'. The notified corridor must be in place before an application can be submitted for assessment.
- Anticipated in May, landowners will be advised by the Minister for Planning that a notified corridor has been declared which will be registered on property titles.
- The main purpose of putting a notified corridor in place is to ensure any future developments do not prevent the project from going ahead while it is in the assessment phase.
