Current state

Current regional skills and training solutions:

- TasTAFE
- UTAS
- Private RTO's (local, mainland)
- Industry-endorsed training solutions (i.e. TMEC)

Current considerations:

- How is training delivered?
- Where is it being delivered?
- What infrastructure is being used to facilitate the delivery of training?
- Are the suite of training services in the greater NW region meeting current and future need?

Current state

Current challenges in the training market:

- Attracting, recruiting and retaining industry-current trainers
- Funding for appropriate infrastructure
- Consumer confidence

What's working well:

- Developing relationships with industry and examples of excellence
- Collaboration with UTAS and peak industry associations
- Existing examples of success with organisations delivering training solutions for industry

Future state

How do we make sense of what is needed across major energy projects in the NW?

How does this translate across similar skills and training priorities in other industries – including infrastructure, advanced manufacturing, construction and agriculture?

What does the region specifically need to address/prepare for with respect to:

- Training infrastructure
- Learning resources
- Industry/training organisation collaborative delivery models
 - Including shared infrastructure, resources and co-delivery

Current vs future state

TasTAFE engagement of an independent consultant

- Environmental scan of current workforce, economic development and relevant strategic plans that align with making sense of the skills and training priorities for the region
- Individual consultation with key stakeholders
- Final report: current vs future state

Intended outcomes:

- Clear advise to TasTAFE and partners on training priorities pertinent to the greater NW region
- Clarity on the opportunity for TasTAFE to partner with stakeholders in meeting current and future needs of industry in the region.

Next steps

Initial consultant work has commenced

Likely stakeholder engagement to span across July and August

Final recommendations and an overarching document to be completed by October 2023
