Since July, the Draft Framework has been shared and feedback collected from community members and a range of stakeholders through the following engagement activities:

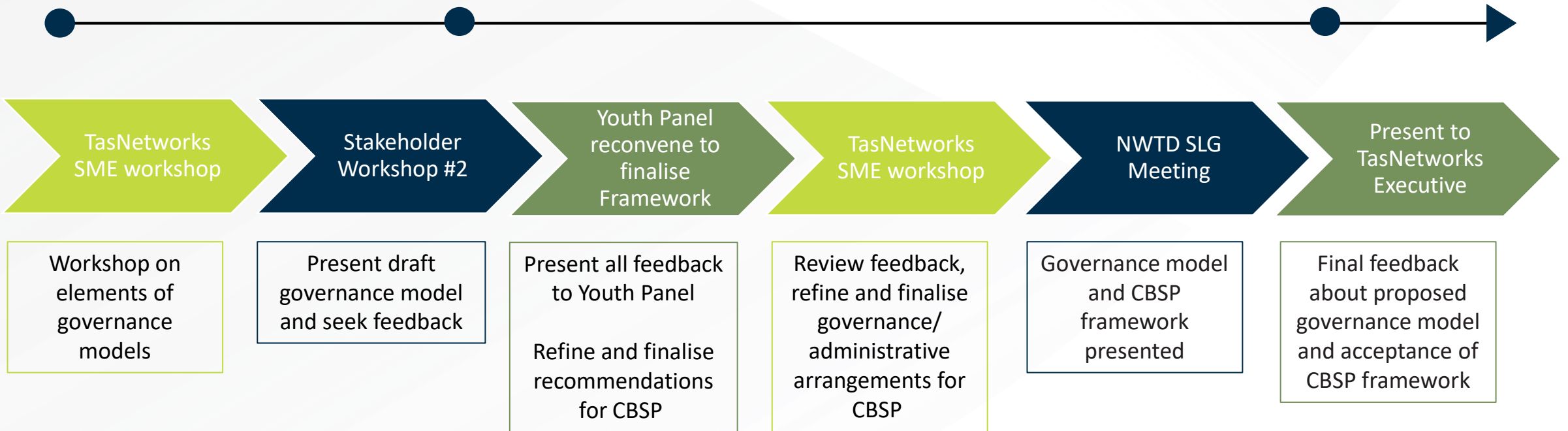
- Two community BBQs – in Burnie and Sheffield, assisted by Youth Panel members
