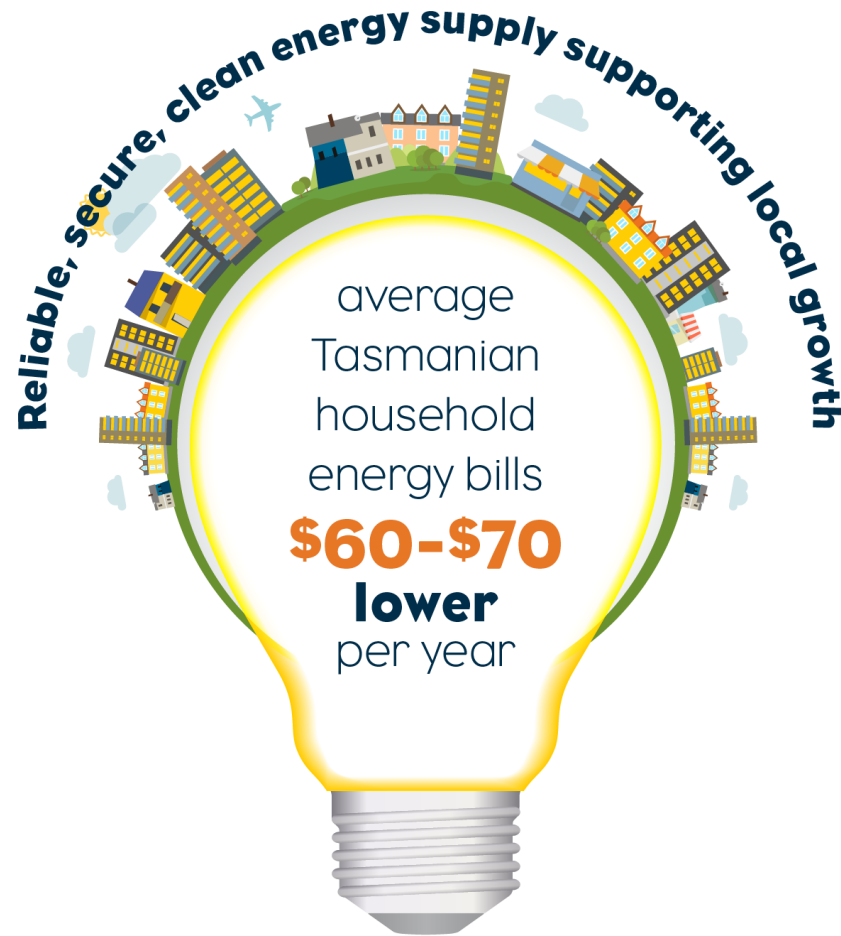


Historic Funding Agreement

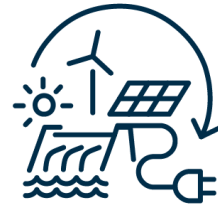
- Australian, Tasmanian and Victorian governments to contribute equally to a combined 20% equity share in Marinus Link.
- Remaining 80% funded via an Australian Government 'Rewiring the Nation' loan.
- Tasmanian customers will pay no more than 15% of estimated total project costs for both Marinus Link and the North West Transmission Developments.
- The average Tasmanian household energy bill will be \$60-70 lower per year with Marinus Link.
- NEM customers from other states will also contribute to the cost of the project.



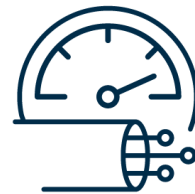

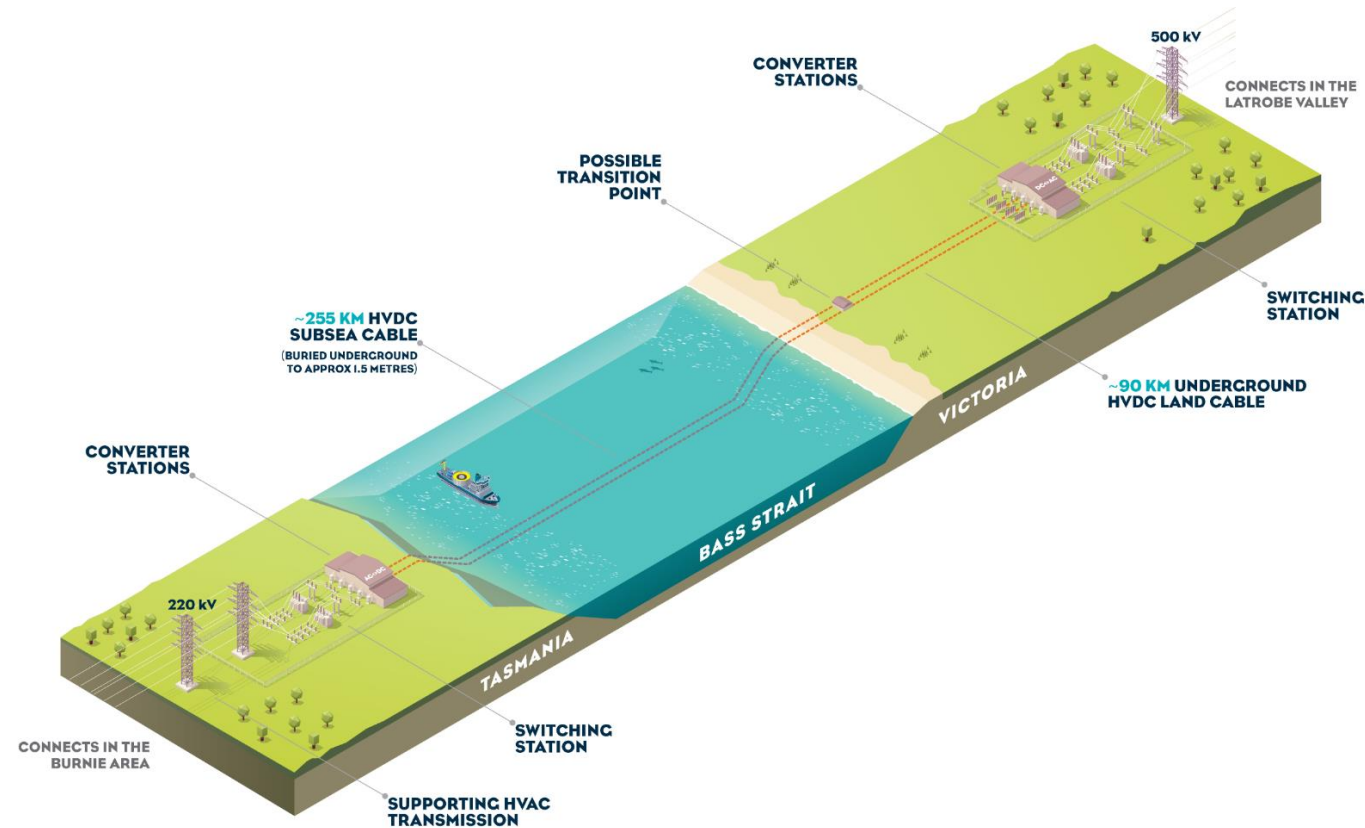

Proposed Heybridge Converter Station Update

Planning:

- A Development Application submitted to Burnie City Council
- Environmental referrals submitted to EPA Tasmania
 - Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) guidelines released for public comment in August 2022
 - Final EIS guidelines released in September 2022
 - Continued development of converter station technical design

Surveys:

- Geotechnical, hydrology and traffic assessment surveys completed
- Air quality, noise and vibration surveys underway

Engagement:

- Social Impact Assessments underway
- Localised North West Tasmania engagement continuing



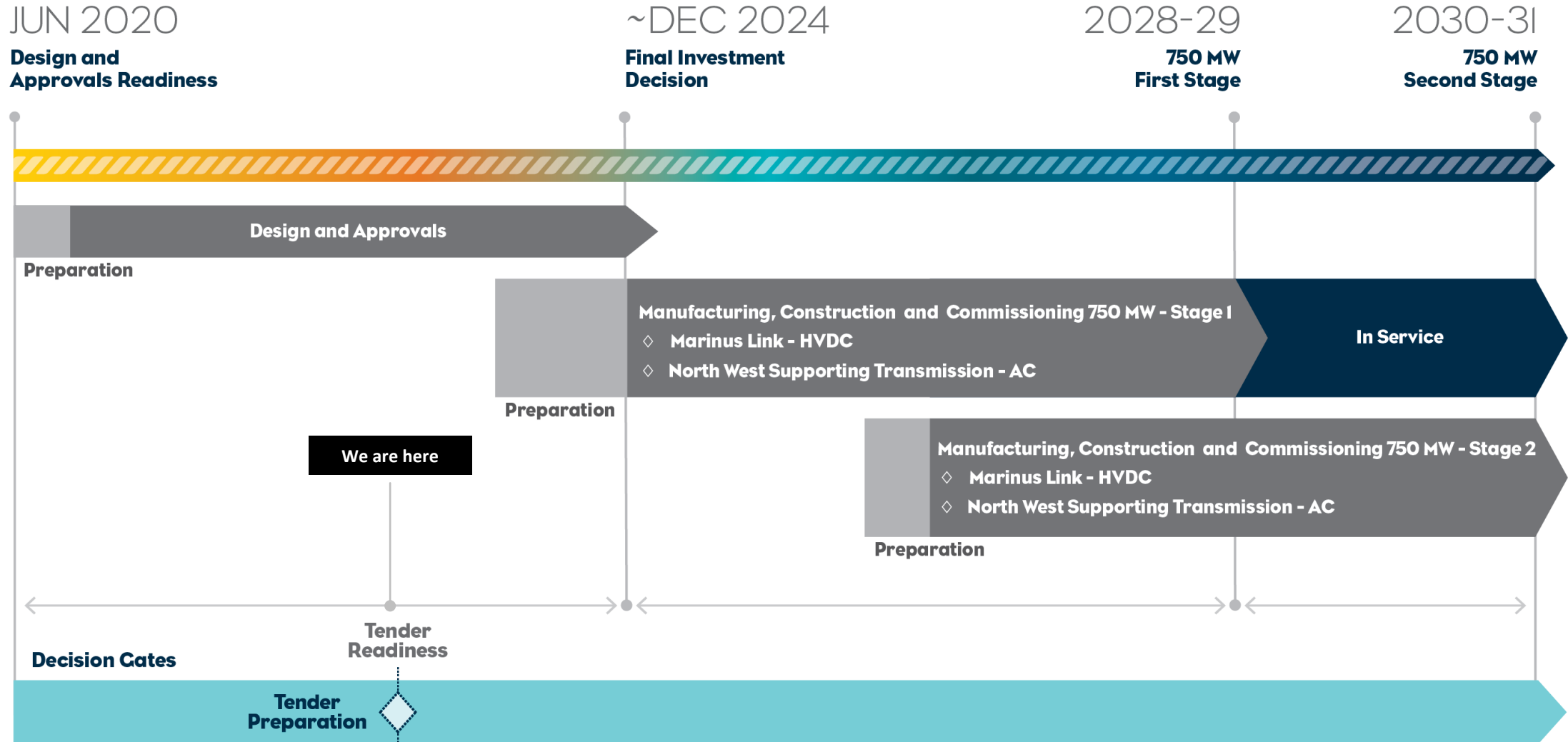
