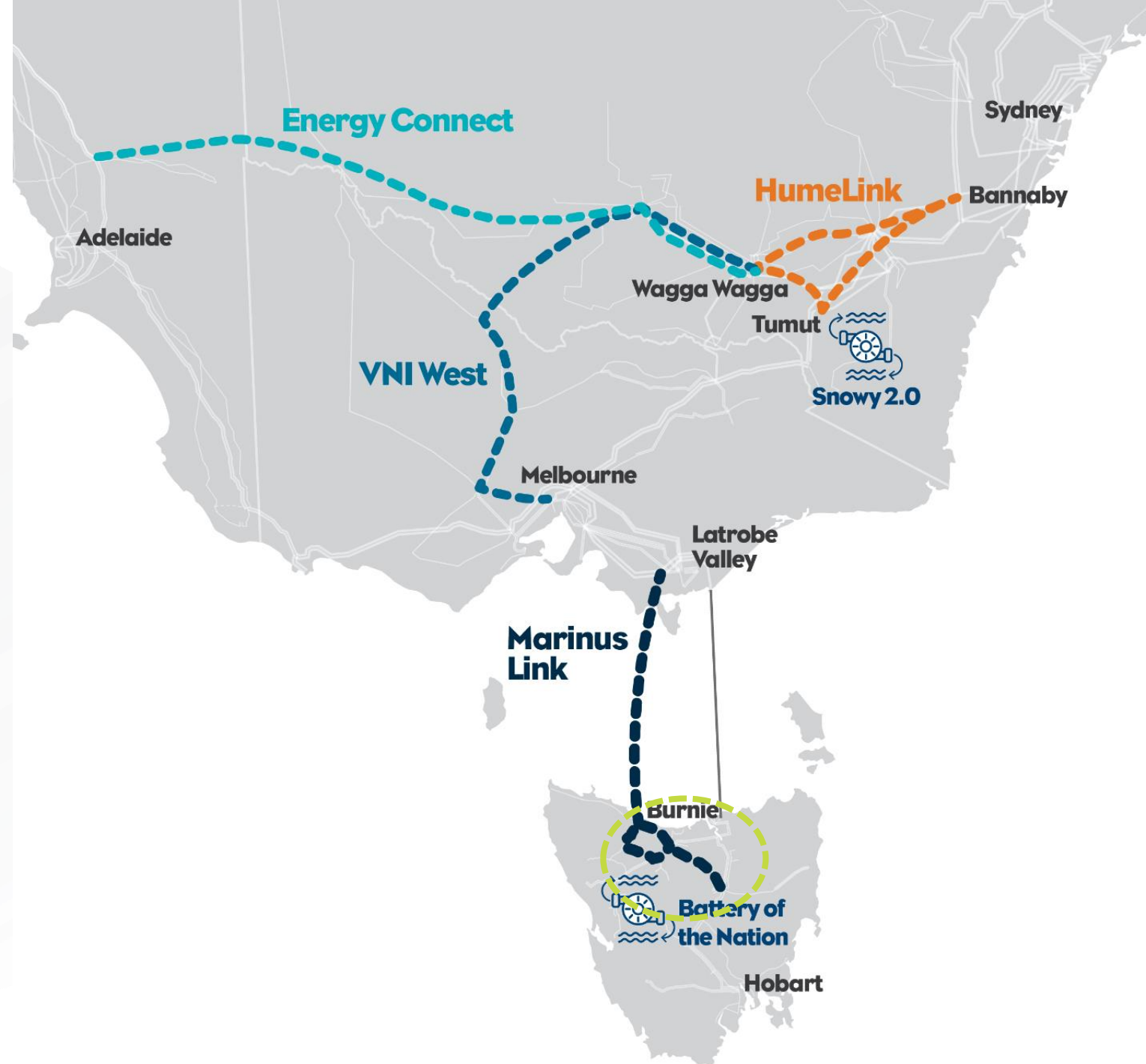
Marinus Link

1500MW HVDC VIC/TAS interconnector (~250km subsea, ~75-85km land) with switching and converter stations.

North West Transmission Developments

HVAC developments comprised of ~240km 220kV transmission line and substation/switching stations

The North West Transmission Developments will increase Tasmania's transmission network capacity, enabling the connection of Marinus Link and a pipeline of future renewable energy projects in Tasmania's north west.



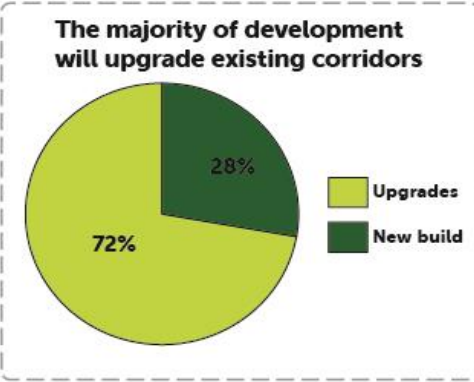

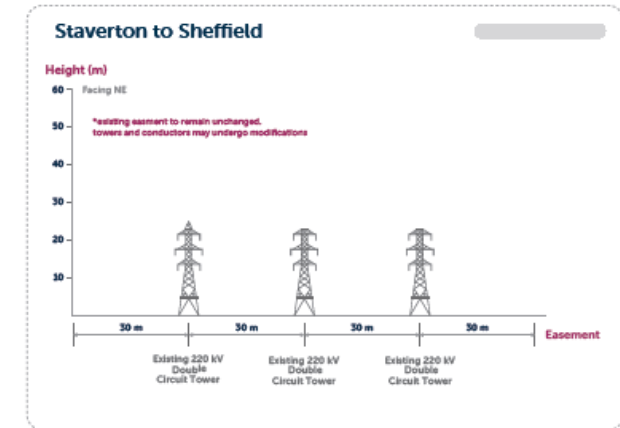
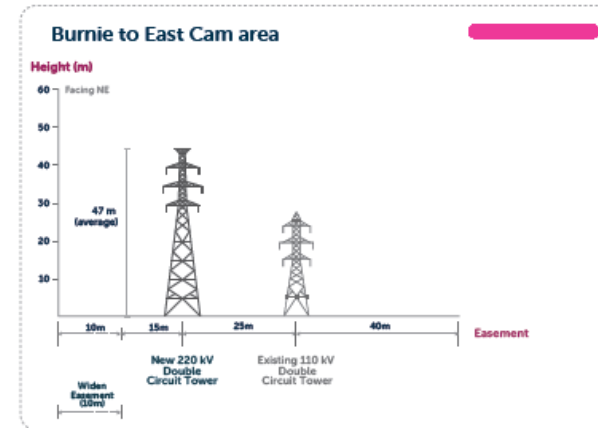
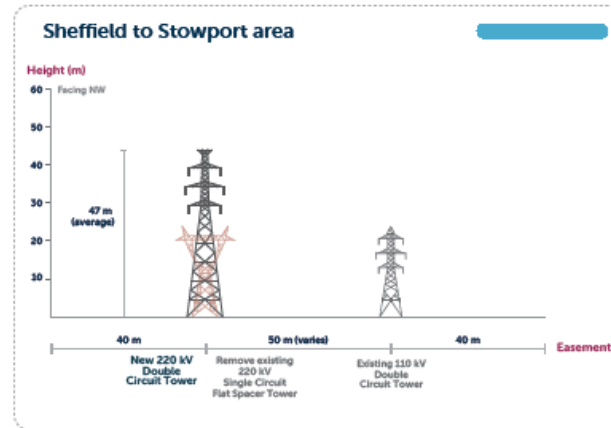
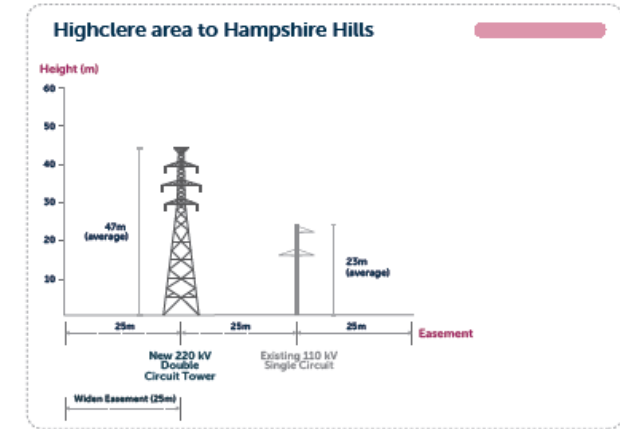
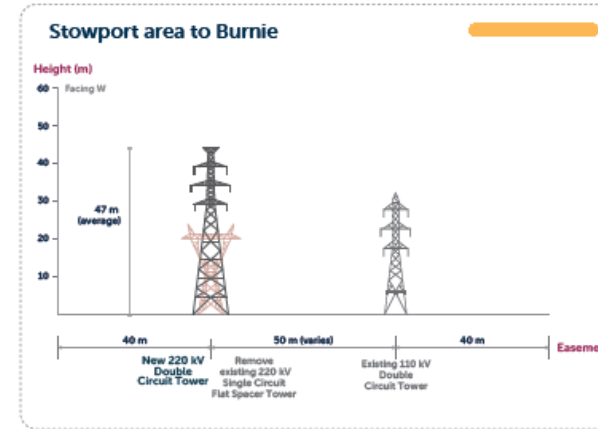
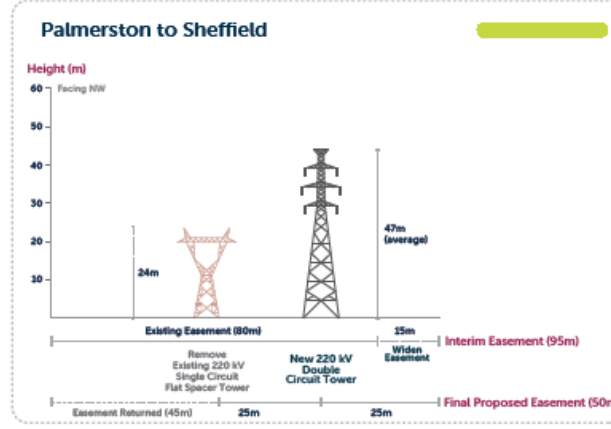
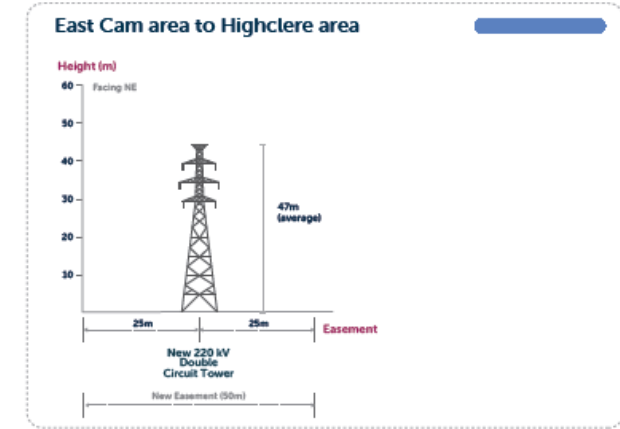
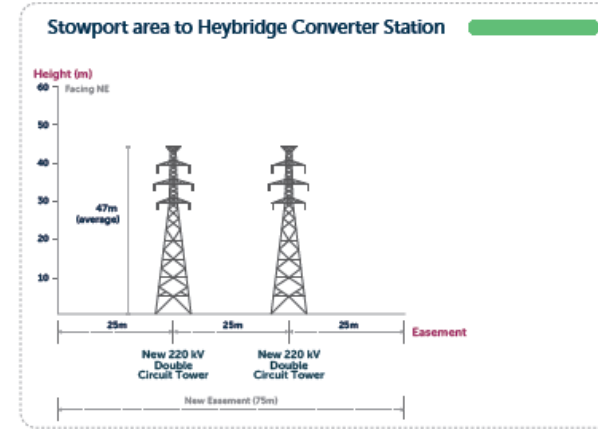
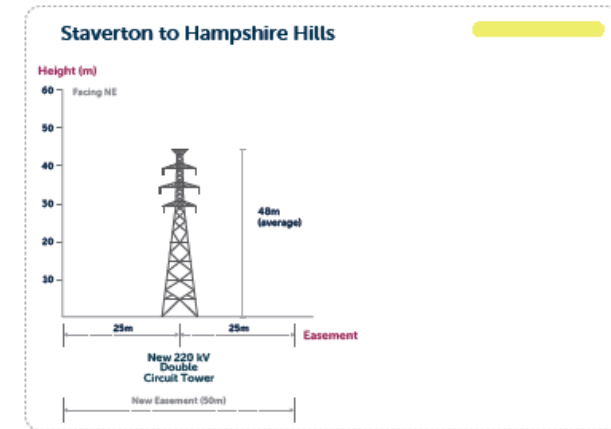


North West Transmission Developments - Towers and easements

*Tower designs and easements are indicative only and will vary depending on use, location, elevation and final technical design.

NWTD route descriptions

- 1 **Palmerston to Sheffield**
Length: ~80km - New towers: ~190
- 2 **Sheffield to Stowport area**
Length: ~42km - New towers: ~95
- 3 **Stowport area to Heybridge Converter Station**
Length: ~3.2km - New towers: ~18
- 4 **Stowport area to Burnie**
Length: ~5km - New towers: ~14
- 5 **Burnie to East Cam area**
Length: ~4.6km - New towers: ~13
- 6 **East Cam area to Highclere area**
Length: ~15.2km - New towers: ~28
- 7 **Highclere area to Hampshire Hills**
Length: ~9.3km - New towers: ~20
- 8 **Staverton to Hampshire Hills**
Length: ~60km - New towers: ~125
- 9 **Staverton to Sheffield**
Length: ~20km - New towers: 0 (existing)

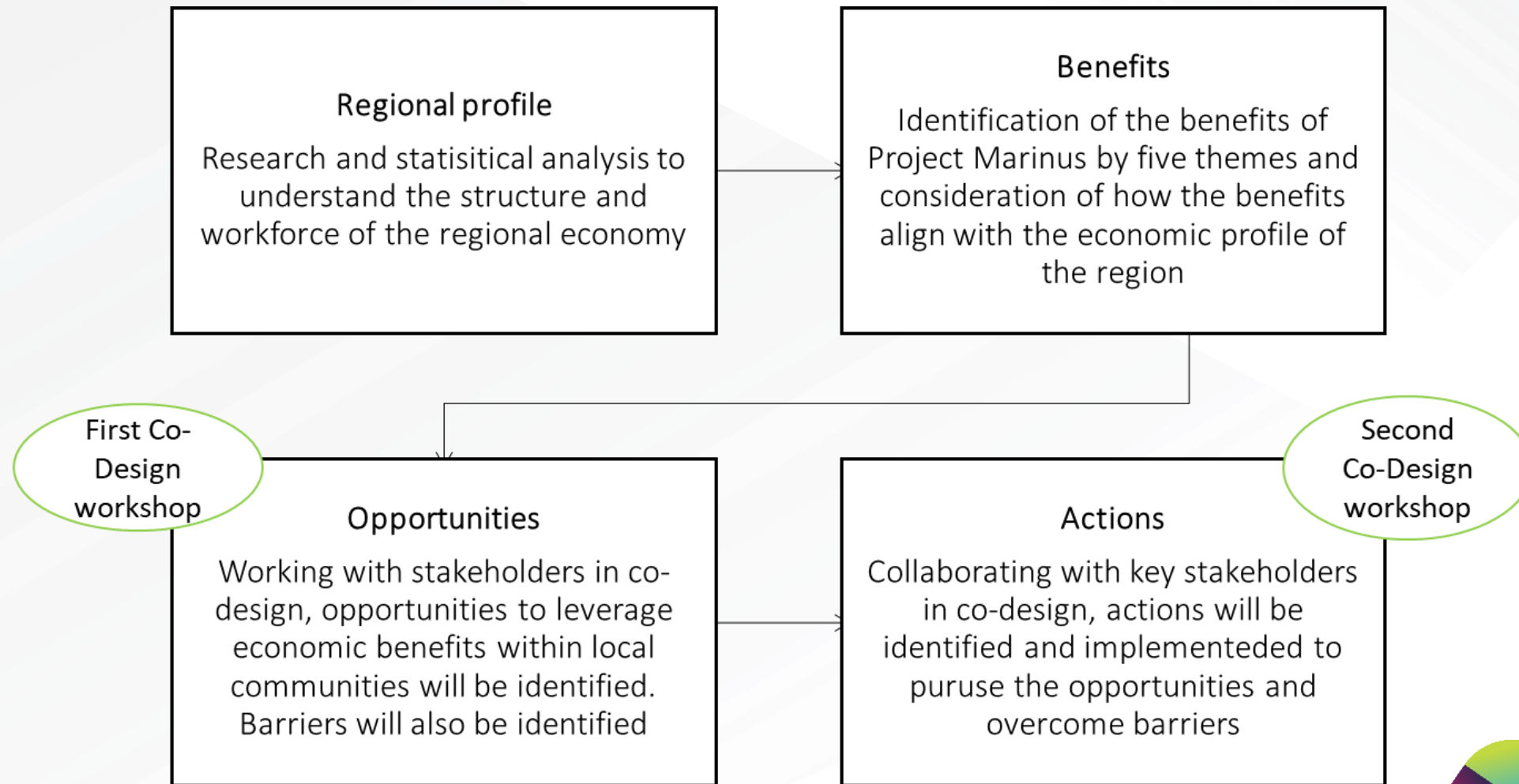
