More formally, as part of the comprehensive approvals process, community members will also be provided with opportunity to make written submissions on the NWTD Environmental Impact Statement and Development Application when these documents are placed on public exhibition by the Tasmanian Planning Commission in the first half of 2025. We will be advertising these key opportunities to engage via our website, newsletter and social media.
