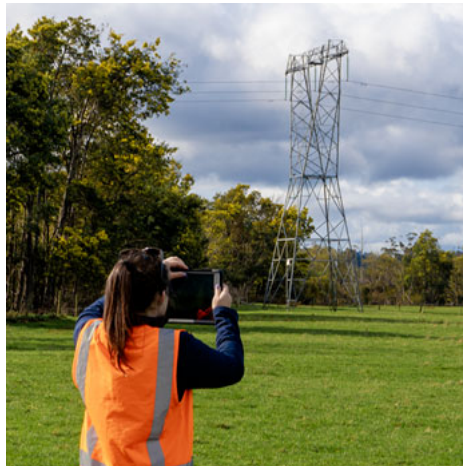




NWTD News - November 2024

A huge number of locals and visitors turned out to support the state's creative arts and small businesses at the [Tasmanian Craft Fair](#), held in Deloraine this month.

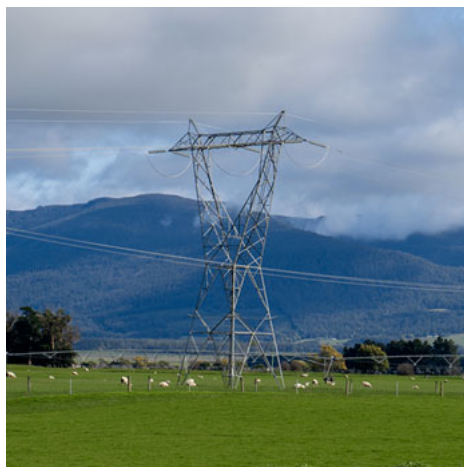
Our team enjoyed being a part of this wonderful showcase and had many great conversations about all things TasNetworks and the NWTD project.

A wonderful series of wellbeing events were hosted by RAW across North West Tasmania recently, giving community members an opportunity to come together for some fun, creativity and laughter.

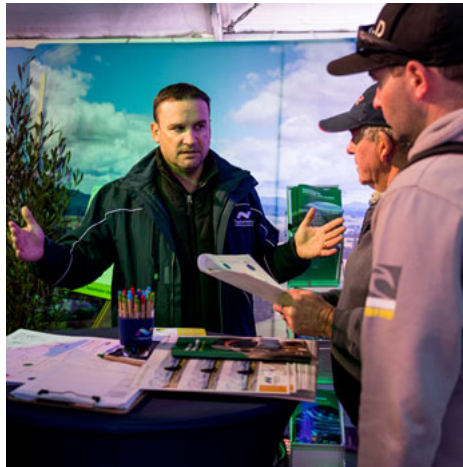
